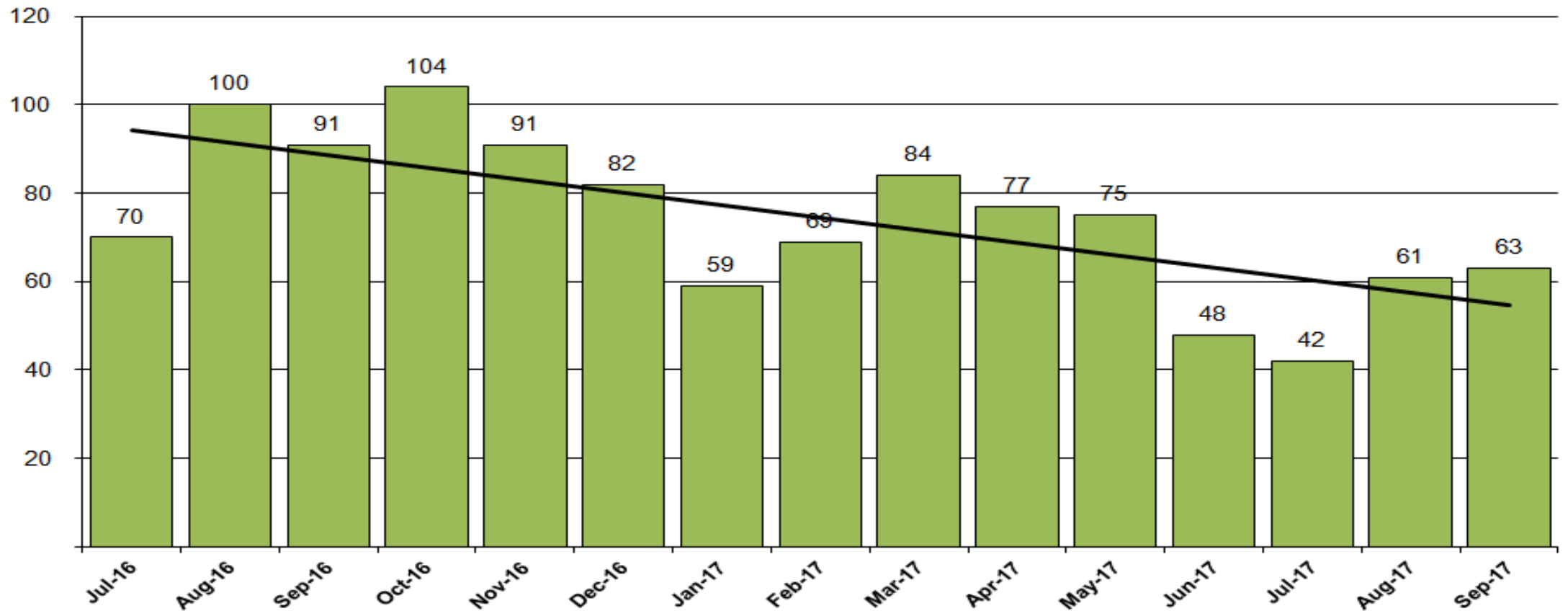

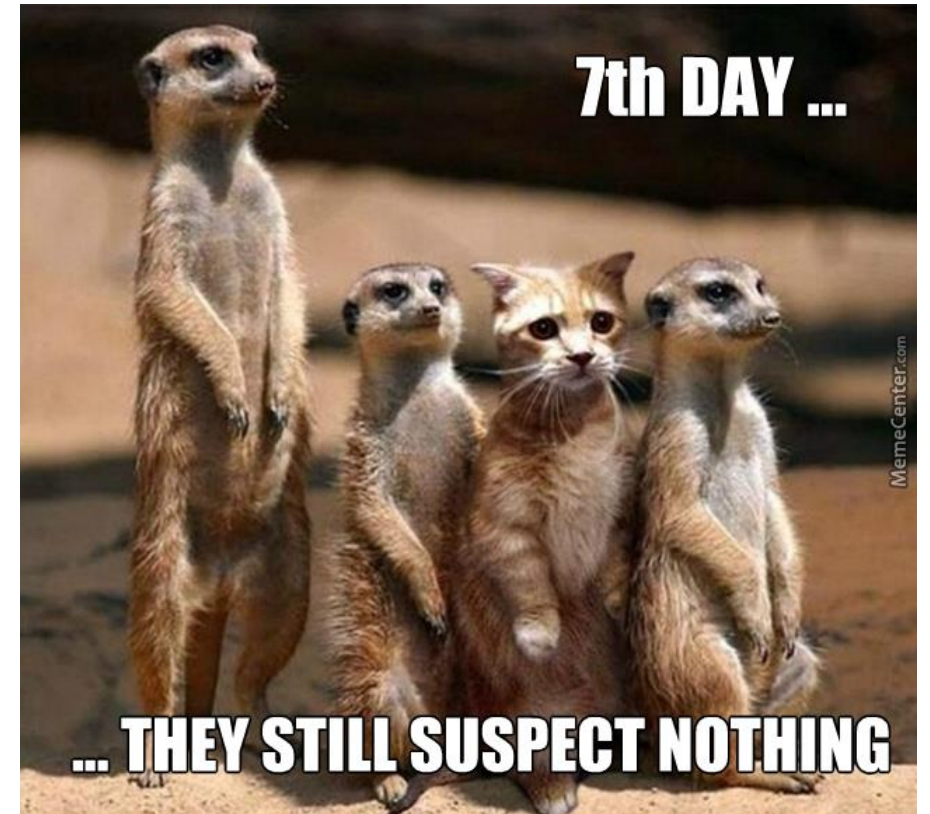

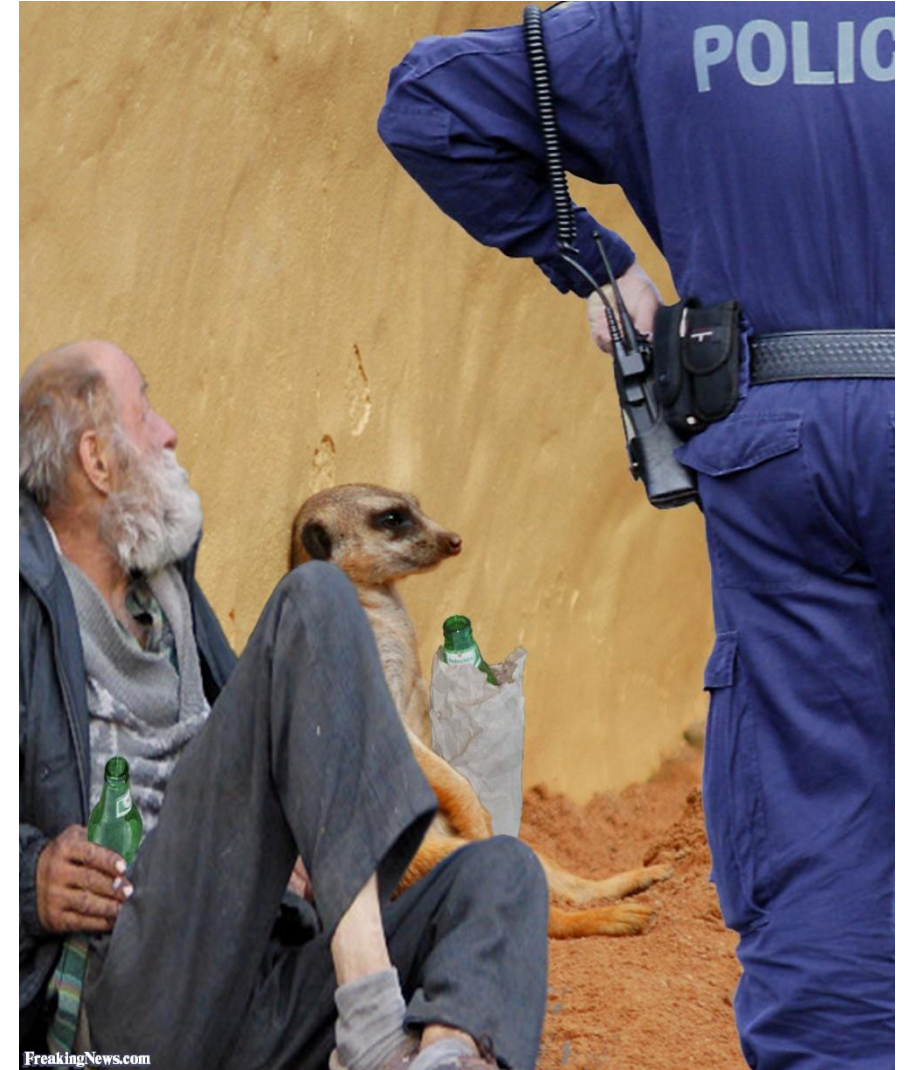

- To serve as the “eyes and ears” for local police services, thereby assisting to safeguard the Obs community against criminal activities and strive for a safe and secure environment.

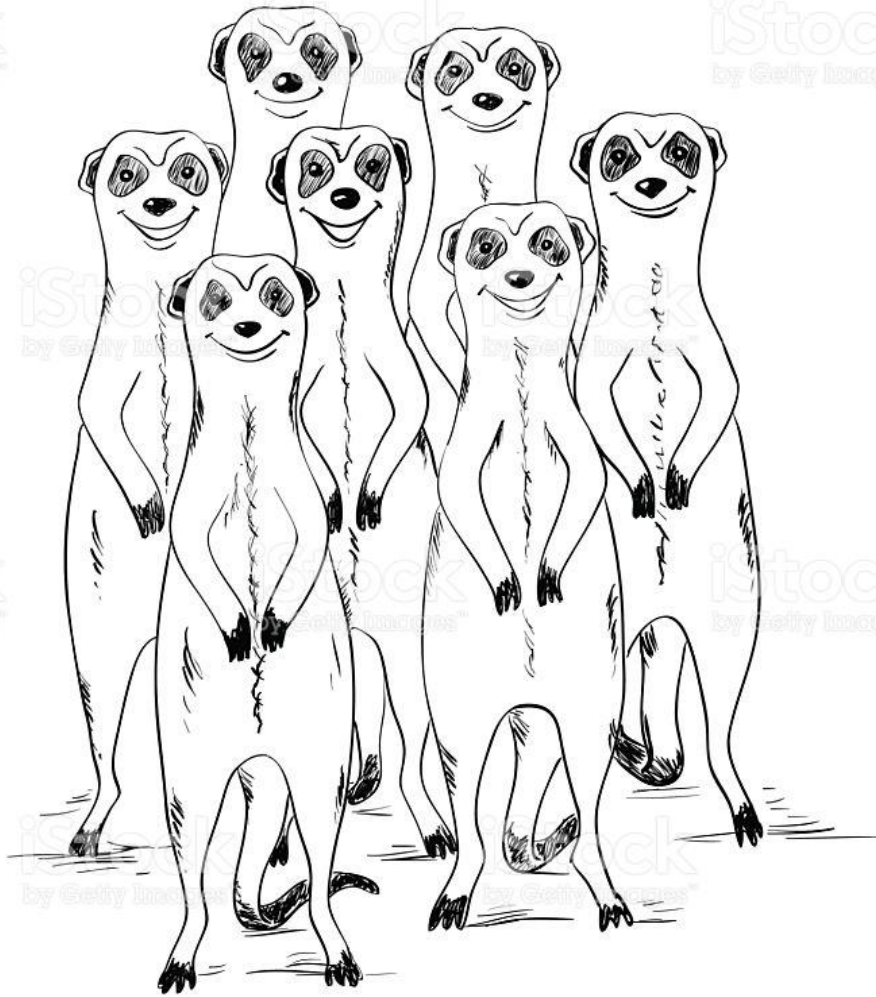


- To provide a channel through which the community can play a meaningful role in crime prevention. This includes formal patrols and operations in conjunction with SAPS and other safety and security role players.
